Vintage independent cinemas like Roseville Cinema are back in the spotlight, given fresh life by young audiences along with our own Cinema & Dining Members eager to venture out for old-style movie box office glamour.



It's Tuesday night at the movies and, as the lights come up on the final credits, the gorgeous old 1936 art deco theatre fills with the hubbub of excited voices and the scuffle of patrons getting to their feet and filing out. Most of them, anyway. Little knots of people stay in their seats, talking over what they've just seen, and Emma Addario sighs. This is her least favourite part of -cinema ownership. "People get so -excited and want to stay and chat, but I have to go over and say, 'I'm really sorry, but the -cinema is closing,' or 'I've got to let the next audience in'," says Addario, 53, who inherited the Roseville Cinema on Sydney's upper

north shore from her father at the age of just 17 and started running it two years later.

"I hate to do it because I love seeing how much they've enjoyed sharing the experience," she says, "something you'd never get from staying home watching TV. That's the magic of cinema. It's pure escapism and time out from busy lives and, in a cinema like this, people feel cosy and welcomed. Now we're seeing a lot of younger people -starting to come too, because they like the nostalgia. That really appeals to a new generation."

I bring up the story of the Roseville Cinema as we have within our club Cinema & Dining organised by the enthusiastic Activity Leader Doug Chee held at the Roseville Cinema & next door dining to encourage additional members to join his regulars to feast on his dinner selection and enjoy the BIG screen cinema viewing.

SCAMS Awareness! - Think twice about clicking on an unlikely celebrity endorsement in emails or texts etc. Artificial Intelligence (AI) can fake people's pictures & voices. Be careful!

Scammers are busy this time of year - especially around Black Friday and Christmas. They try to trick people into giving out money or passwords, and sometimes pretend to be your bank, or other trusted brands.

Please stay alert and remember to: **Stop, don't rush to "click here"**. It could be fake! Avoid paying via phone links or email links. Never share passwords via phone or email!

Check, look carefully at the sender's email address. Are there spelling mistakes? If so, don't open! Always preview! Visit official websites to confirm payments and due dates. Only enter your username and password on official websites.

Protect, manage your payments safely. Use a different password for each service or website. If you think you've been scammed, reset your password and notify your bank.

Watch out for fake online stores. For prices that seem too good to be true and for any pressure to act quickly so you don't miss out on an offer.

Beware of emails, text messages and advertisements that pop up on your screen with links to unbelievable sales. These may contain malicious software or direct you to fake websites that steal your information.

Don't trust - Websites with blurry logos or images or 'look too good' or sellers who ask you to pay with gift cards or cryptocurrency.

Service NSW Advice re Scams: Look out for these warning signs on the shopping sites you visit:

- prices much lower than anywhere else,
- spelling mistakes and poor grammar,
- no refund or return policy page,
- vague or minimal contact information.

It only takes 10 minutes to learn how to grab bargains more safely - do the free online shopping course from 'ID Support NSW'.

Car Insurance for older cars, it is worth dropping from agreed value to market value in comprehensive insurance policies to save money!

Motorway Toll relief. For toll payments over \$60 for private vehicles rebates have been reinstated. For toll spend between \$60 and \$400 a week per tag and/or licence plate number on their personal toll account, for personal toll trips in a vehicle registered for private use, rebates of up to \$340 a week for each tag and licence plate number are available. **See Service NSW**

BLACK FRIDAY (28 Nov.) specials are available at many shops & many will extend for a few days after the 28th!

Use Paypal, Apple Pay, Google Pay, and digital wallets when you can, to pay for goods & services in order to you keep your debit & credit card details secret.
